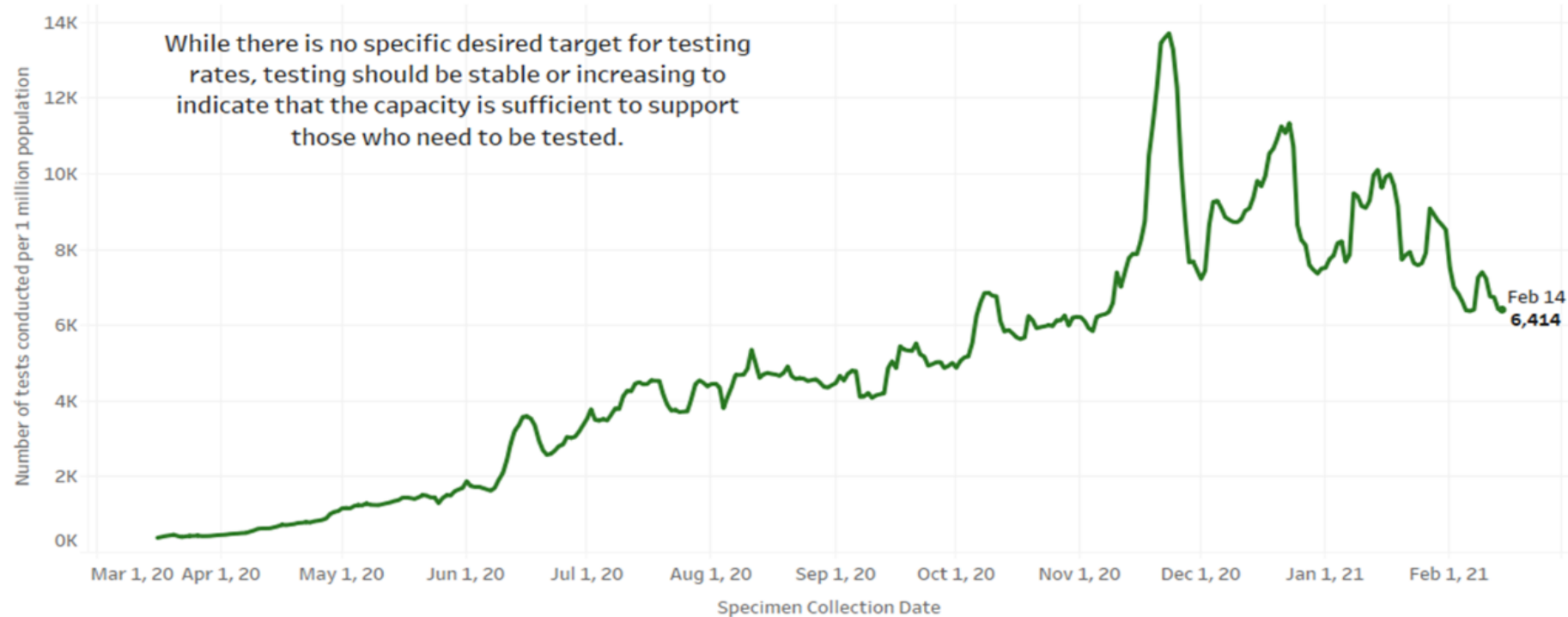

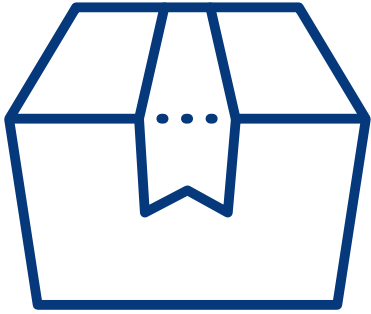

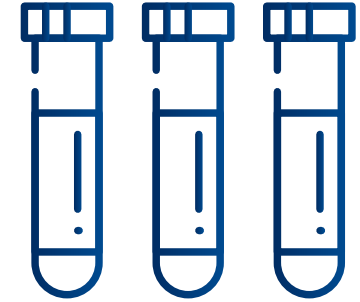

RECOVERY UPDATES
