

DC residents may be vaccinated outside of the DC-area and are not included in this report. Non-DC residents may be vaccinated within DC, especially those who fall into prioritized non-resident categories. Administration may be impacted by holidays and weekends, and is impacted by the size of prioritized groups and vaccine supply. Individuals who receive single dose regimens such as J&J are considered fully vaccinated.





Beginning June 1, the District will restart several government functions— such as all parking enforcement, towing of illegally parked vehicles, and requirements to renew vehicle registrations and inspections— that had been suspended during the coronavirus (COVID-19) public health emergency.



JUNE 1 START DATE

- All parking enforcement
- Towing of vehicles violating parking zones (plus associated fines)
- Street sweeping and SWEEP enforcement
- Vehicles must display valid DC registration and inspection stickers
- New tiered residential parking permit fees
- Parking, photo, and/or minor moving violation tickets issued after June 1 will be subject to adjudication hearing timelines listed on the back of the ticket

JULY 1 START DATE

- Booting of vehicles with two or more unsatisfied tickets that are 60 days old
- All DC driver license and ID Card holders must display a valid credential
- Renewal applications accepted for occupational and professional licenses
- DC medical cannabis program patient or caregiver registration card must have a valid expiration date

TICKET AMNESTY PROGRAM

A new four-month ticket amnesty program will give drivers the opportunity to pay outstanding tickets for parking, photo enforcement (including speed, red-light, and stop sign), and minor moving violations. Drivers eligible for the amnesty program are still obligated to pay the original ticket amount; however, any penalties will be waived. Department of Public Works (DPW) tow and storage fees, if any, will not be waived.



The amnesty program will run from June 1, 2021 to September 30, 2021, and includes tickets issued before September 30, 2021.

EXPANDED LIBRARY OPERATIONS

Starting May 3:

- The DC Public Library will add Saturday hours at its open locations
- The Deanwood and Southeast Libraries will begin providing limited in-person services
- **Operating hours will be Monday through Saturday, 10:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.**
- The library will no longer close from 2:00 to 3:00 p.m.
 - Regular cleaning throughout the day will continue as well as additional cleaning in the event there is a COVID-19 positive case at a library location.



The new Southwest Library will open May 6.

RECOVERY UPDATES

The U.S. Small Business Administration released information about applying for the

\$28.6 billion Restaurant Revitalization

Fund, which will provide emergency assistance to eligible restaurants, bars, and other qualifying businesses impacted by COVID-19. The program will provide restaurants with funding equal to their pandemic-related revenue loss

up to \$10 million per business (no more than \$5 million per physical location).



Eligible entities include:

- Restaurants
- Food stands, food trucks, food carts
- Caterers
- Bars, saloons, lounges, taverns
- Snack and nonalcoholic beverage bars
- Bakeries Brewpubs, tasting rooms, taprooms
- Breweries and/or microbreweries
- Wineries and distilleries
- Inns
- Licensed facilities or premises of a beverage alcohol producer where the public may taste, sample, or purchase products

The SBA also expects to reopen the Shuttered Venue Operators Grant application portal soon. Through this **\$16 billion program**, eligible applicants affected by COVID-19 may qualify for

grants equal to 45% of their gross earned revenue, up to \$10 million.



Eligible entities include:

- Live venue operators or promoters
- Theatrical producers
- Live performing arts organization operators
- Motion picture theater operators
- Talent representatives
- Relevant museum operators, zoos and aquariums who meet specific criteria
- Each business entity owned by an eligible entity that also meets the eligibility requirements
