Antibody Testing

DC Health and the Department of Forensic Sciences are working with health care providers in DC to conduct a citywide sero-prevalence survey to understand the rates of exposure to COVID-19 in the District of Columbia.

The survey will focus on individuals with a high risk of exposure, including health care workers, first responders, essential workers, and individuals living in congregate settings.

Serology testing will help us determine the extent of infection and agespecific cumulative incidence, including the prevalence of asymptomatic or subclinical infections.




