


New Cases by Day

In DC, we have flattened the curve, but we have not eradicated the virus.





Hospital Census and Bed Availability at District Acute Care Hospitals




Washingtonians continue to be hospitalized with COVID-19.

We have lost 541 neighbors to the virus.


Each life lost was someone's family member, friend, neighbor, mentor, loved one.
