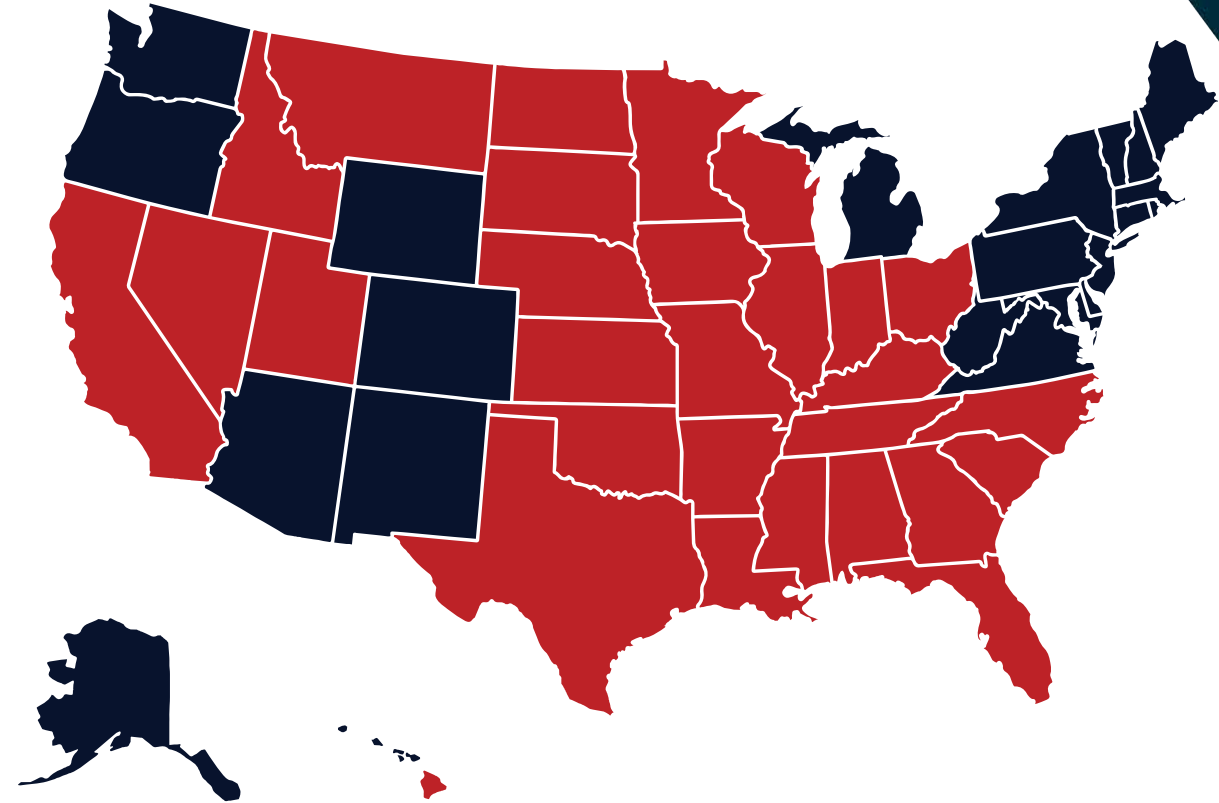
Metric	Where we are today (data as of 9/7/20)
Community Spread	
Sustained decrease in community spread	Increasing trend
Low transmission rate (R_t)	$R_t = 0.80$
Testing Capacity	
Low positivity rate	2.7%
Health Care System Capacity	
Sufficient health care capacity without surge	73.3%
Contact Tracing	
Make first contact attempt for new positive cases within 1 day of notification	98.8%
Make first contact attempt for close contacts of new positive cases within 2 days of identification	93%
Percent of positive cases from quarantined contacts	7.4%

States that were removed from the updated list include: Alaska and Arizona.

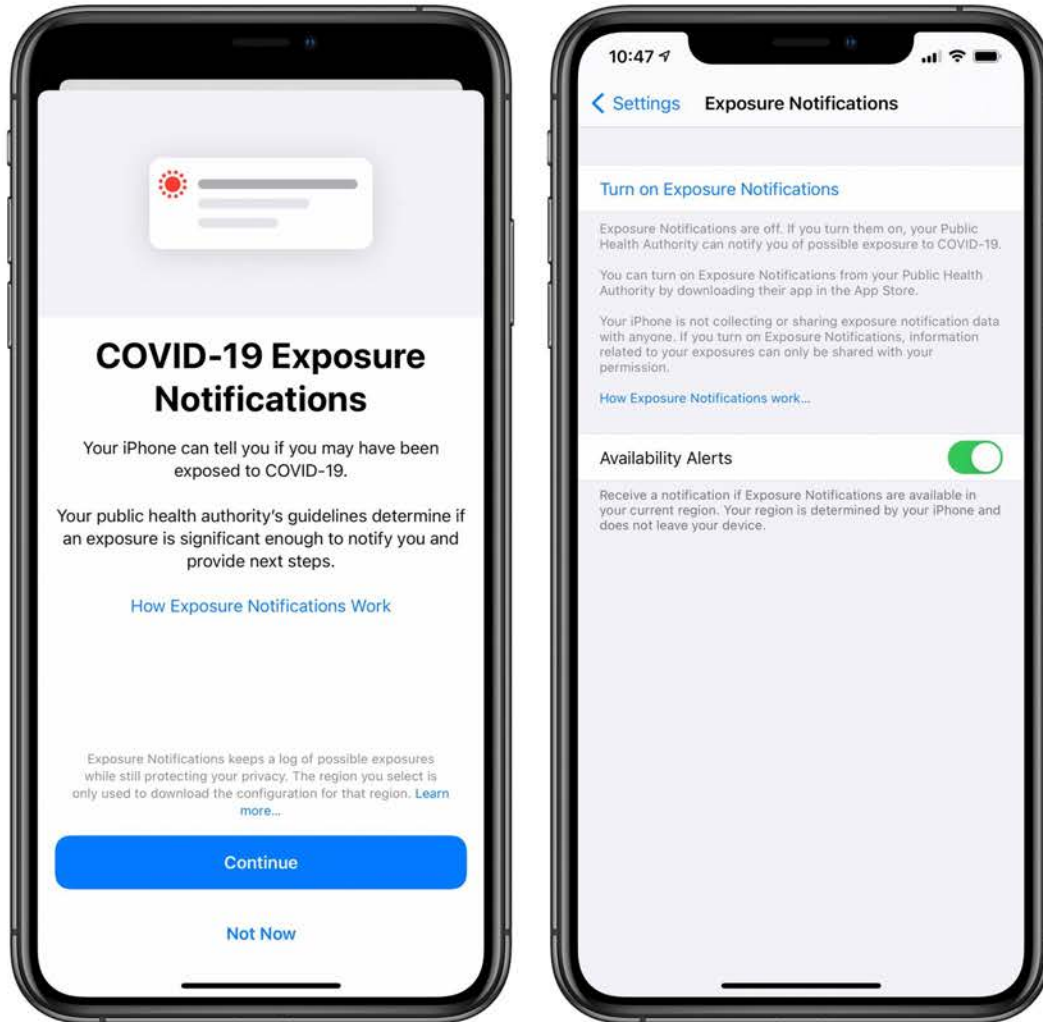

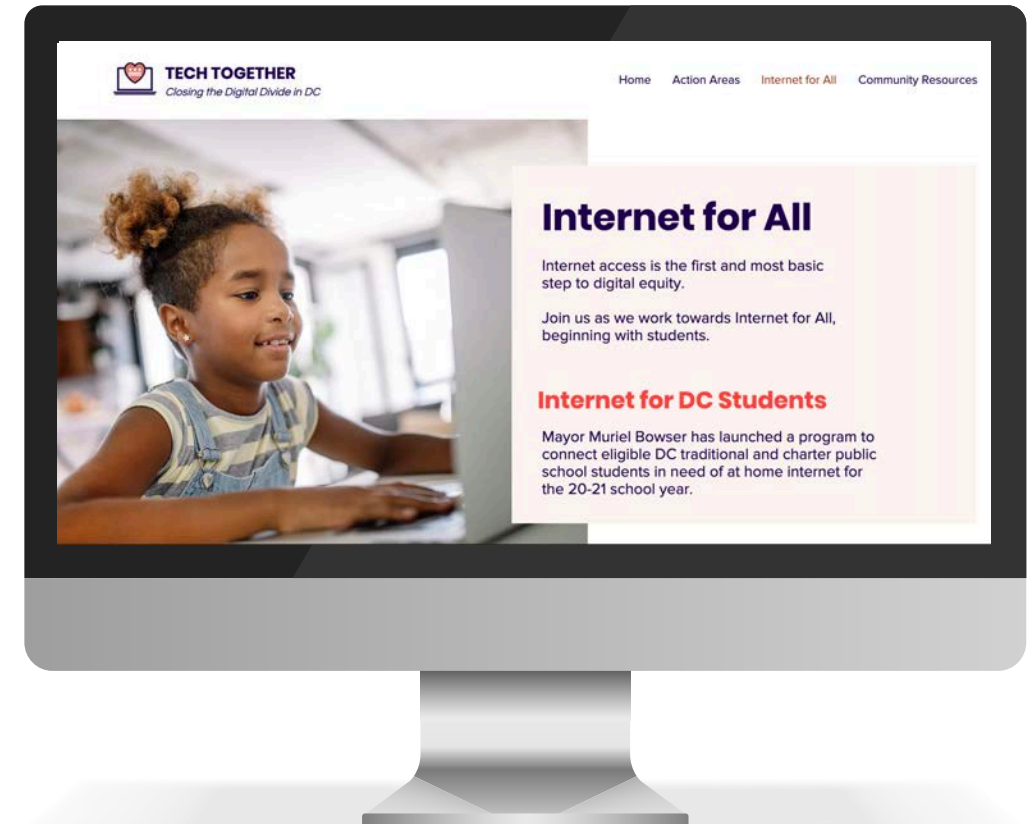
