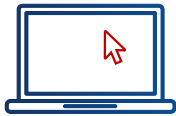

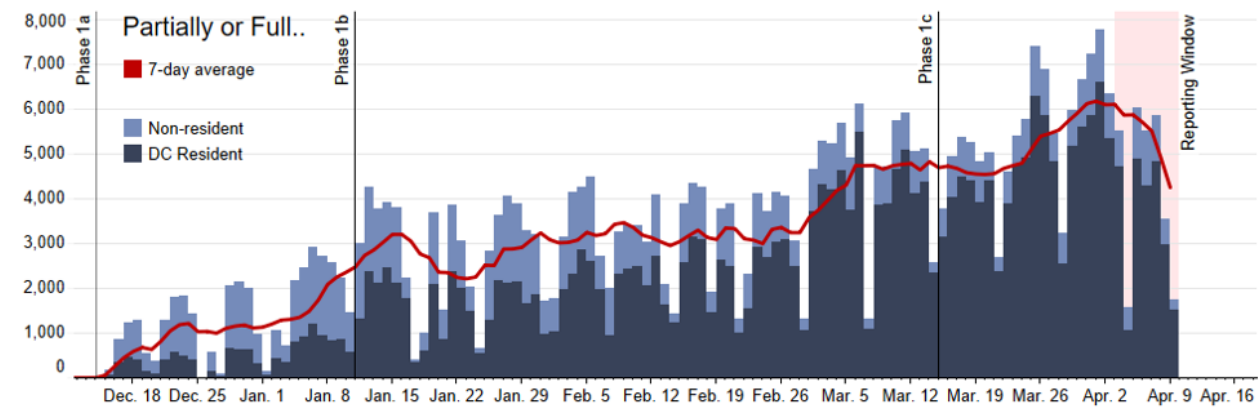

Metric Definition: Number of administrations reported by DC-area providers by date of vaccine administration. The 7-day rolling average represents the average number of administrations including the past 6 days.

Data Considerations: There may be a lag time between vaccine administration and provider report. This may impact the reporting of vaccine administered, especially in the three most recent days of report, highlighted in red above. DC residents may be vaccinated outside of the DC-area and are not included in this report. Non-DC residents may be vaccinated within DC, especially those who fall into prioritized non-resident categories. Administration may be impacted by holidays and weekends, and is impacted by the size of prioritized groups and vaccine supply. Individuals who receive single dose regimens such as J&J are considered fully vaccinated.

RECOVERY UPDATES

Multiple programs have been created, or expanded, during the public health emergency to address housing instability and protect DC's affordable housing.

- **\$1.5M** for the Tenant Based Rental Assistance Program (TBRA)
- **\$20M** for the COVID-19 Housing Assistance Program (CHAP)
- **\$11.5M** for the Housing Stabilization Grants
- **\$1M** for the DC Mortgage Assistance Program (DC MAP)
- **\$14M** for the Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP)
- **\$27.7M** for the Emergency Solutions Grants
- **\$16M** for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

STAY DC replaces CHAP and will augment ERAP and LIHEAP.



STAY DC is the District's new emergency rental assistance program to help households unable to pay rent and utilities due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The District is receiving approximately **\$352 million** in new federal Emergency Rental Assistance (ERA) funds for STAY DC and related efforts.

STAY DC helps DC residents facing housing instability due to the pandemic pay **up to 12 months of past due rent/utilities** and **3 months of forward rent/utilities** at a time.

The STAY DC program is administered by the Department of Human Services (DHS) in collaboration with the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development (DMPED), the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Health and Human Services (DMHHS), Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD), and the Department of Energy and the Environment (DOEE).

STAY DC will provide support to residents through:

- **Back Rent:** Funding can be used to pay unpaid rent going back to April 1, 2020
- **Upcoming Rent:** Money can be used to pay forward rent, up to 3 months at a time
- **Utility Expenses:** Water, gas, and electricity expenses can be paid on your behalf
- **Extended Support:** Housing support is available for up to 18 months, per tenant

Applicants can call 833-4-STAYDC from 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m., Monday through Friday to get assistance. Call takers will answer your questions during the call, or in some cases may need to call you back. Please be prepared to leave your name and contact information.

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GENERAL UPDATES

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**All public schools in Washington, DC
will fully open for in-person
learning, five days a week,
with all educators back in the classroom.**

DCPS enrollment is now open at enrolldcps.dc.gov

The upcoming budget will include a 3.6% increase to the uniform per student funding formula (UPSFF). Additionally, the District will receive from the American Rescue Plan a third round of Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief funds totaling over \$386 million.

HEALTH INSURANCE SAVINGS

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The American Rescue Plan lowers health insurance premiums. For DC residents, the American Rescue Plan reduces premiums for health insurance through DC Health Link, provides health insurance for as little as \$2/month to people who lost their jobs, and pays for 100% of COBRA premiums for laid-off workers.

On March 29, the District opened its online health insurance marketplace - DC Health Link - with all expanded health insurance benefits provided by the American Rescue Plan. DC residents can go to DCHealthLink.com right now to preview their premium savings and enroll in a health plan.

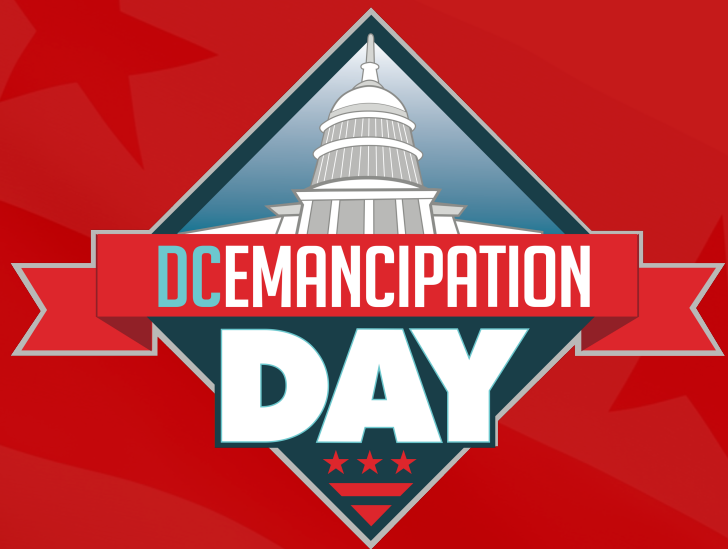


We thank Chairwoman Maloney and Congresswoman Norton for this week's markup and vote on H.R. 51, the Washington, DC Admission Act.
