

WHAT'S PROPOSED **IN THIS YEAR'S BUDGET**

LEARNING & RECREATION

- **\$74 million** to modernize and renovate public schools, including continuing work on the new MacArthur HS, and smaller-scale improvements to Stoddert ES and Hardy MS
- **\$66 million** to modernize and renovate facilities at the University of the District of Columbia, including \$1 million for planning and preliminary design for new student housing
- **\$24 million** to modernize the Chevy Chase Library

TRANSPORTATION & ENVIRONMENT

- \$406 million to maintain streets, sidewalks, and alleys citywide
- **\$164 million** citywide for interventions to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety, including making temporary safety installations permanent and installing new safety infrastructure near schools
- \$26 million for streetscape improvements on Connecticut Avenue NW
- **\$15 million** to install safety fencing on the Taft Memorial Bridge
- **\$7 million** for bus priority improvements along Wisconsin Avenue NW, from M Street NW to Western Avenue, to make bus service faster and more reliable
- **\$4 million** to improve the bicycle and pedestrian connection between the Capital Crescent Trail and Arizona Avenue NW
- \$2 million for planning and design of a new bicycle and pedestrian trail along Military Road between Oregon Avenue and Beach Drive
