

## WHAT'S PROPOSED IN THIS YEAR'S BUDGET

## **LEARNING & RECREATION**

- \$281 million to renovate or modernize public schools, including Langley ES, Bunker Hill ES, Burroughs ES, and Browne EC
- \$45 million to renovate recreation and community centers, including Harry Thomas and Fort Lincoln recreation centers, and Langdon and Crummell community centers
- \$17 million to expand the Advanced Technical Center, creating new CTE programming and an urgent care center



## TRANSPORTATION & ENVIRONMENT

- \$406 million to maintain streets, sidewalks, and alleys citywide
- \$164 million citywide for interventions to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety, including making temporary safety installations permanent and installing new safety infrastructure near schools
- \$43 million for traffic calming and other pedestrian and bicyclist safety improvements on Bladensburg Road
- \$15 million for bus priority improvements on nine segments, including Benning Road NE, Florida Avenue NE, and Rhode Island Avenue NE
- \$5 million for a new trail from the Maryland Avenue entrance of the National Arboretum to the future bridge connecting the Arboretum to the Anacostia River Trail and Kenilworth Park



## **PUBLIC SAFETY & HEALTH**

- \$61 million to replace the existing New York Avenue Men's Shelter
- \$3.5 million to support renovations of the Blair Men's Shelter
- \$900,000 for improvements to the DYRS Youth Service Center
