Establish East of the River Services Office (\$1.4M)



EDUCATION

- ✓ 3 new DCPS full service community schools in Ward 7 & 8 (\$1.6M for all 6 new community schools)
- ✓ New early college high school at Bard (\$2.6M)
- ✓ Expanded home visiting services (\$250K)
- ✓ School modernizations at Aiton, CW Harris, Garfield, Green, Houston, Smothers and Thomas Elementary Schools (\$257.4M)
- ✓ New early childcare center serving kids ages 0-4 at Old Randle Highlands (\$14.7M)



HEALTH CARE

- ✓ Funding to continue support of operations at United Medical Center (\$30M)
- ✓ Funding for a new state-of-the-art hospital at St. Elizabeth's (\$317M)
