INVESTMENTS IN HOUSING & ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

- **\$8M** to continue development of the McMillan site
- **\$32M** for replacement of the New York Avenue Shelter
- **\$44M** to replace the singles shelter for individuals experiencing homelessness



INVESTMENTS IN EDUCATION & COMMUNITIES

- **\$11M** for the renovation of Langdon Elementary to include early childhood education seats
- **\$71M** for the renovation of Burroughs Elementary School
- **\$46.7M** for the renovation of Bunker Hill Elementary School-Early Childhood Education
- **\$10.3M** for the renovation of Langley Elementary School
- **\$110M** for the renovation of Browne Education Campus
- **\$19M** for the renovation of the Harry Thomas Recreation Center
- **\$20M** for the Langdon Community Center redevelopment
- **\$15M** to renovate and convert the Crummel School into a new community center
- **\$14M** for the renovation of DC Infrastructure Academy
- **\$5M** for the renovation of the OSSE 5th Street school bus terminal

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INVESTMENTS IN TRANSPORTATION & ENVIRONMENT

- **\$4.4M** in FY 2023 and **\$23.5M** over the CIP to continue historic investment in bringing Ward 5 streets into a state of good repair
- **\$114M** to rehabilitate, reconstruct, and maintain sidewalks citywide
- **\$102M** to bring alleys into a state of good repair through maintenance and reconstruction
- **\$16.5M** for a new trail and bridge connecting Carver/Langston and the National Arboretum to the Anacostia River Trail
- **\$17M** for streetscape improvements and a new pedestrian and bicycle trail along New York Avenue in the Ivy City neighborhood, providing connections to the Metropolitan Branch Trail and the National Arboretum
- **\$9.8M** to accelerate the S Street NW streetscape between 4th and 7th Streets to FY 2022



INVESTMENTS IN HEALTH & PUBLIC SAFETY

- **\$3.5M** to complete the relocation of the Engine Company 26 fire station
