15 To adopt, as a request, the federal portion of the budget of the government of the District of
16 Columbia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017 (the “budget request”); to
17 request that the President transmit the budget request to the Congress; and to request that
18 the Congress appropriate the funds included in the budget request.
19

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
21 act may be cited as the “Fiscal Year 2017 Budget Federal Portion Adoption and Request Act of
22 2016”.

23 Sec. 2. Adoption of the federal portion of the fiscal year 2017 budget.

24 There is hereby adopted, as a request, the following federal portion of the budget of the
25 government of the District of Columbia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017 (the
26 “budget request”):

27 **DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA FEDERAL FUNDS APPROPRIATION REQUEST**
28

29 **FEDERAL PAYMENT FOR RESIDENT TUITION SUPPORT**

30 For a Federal payment to the District of Columbia, to be deposited into a dedicated
31 account, for a nationwide program to be administered by the Mayor, for District of Columbia
32 resident tuition support, \$40,000,000, to remain available until expended: Provided, That such
33 funds, including any interest accrued thereon, may be used on behalf of eligible District of
34 Columbia residents to pay an amount based upon the difference between in-State and out-of-
35 State tuition at public institutions of higher education, or to pay up to \$2,500 each year at eligible
36 private institutions of higher education: Provided further, That the awarding of such funds may
37 be prioritized on the basis of a resident's academic merit, the income and need of eligible
38 students and such other factors as may be authorized: Provided further, That the District of
39 Columbia government shall maintain a dedicated account for the Resident Tuition Support

40 Program that shall consist of the Federal funds appropriated to the Program in this Act
41 and any subsequent appropriations, any unobligated balances from prior fiscal years, and
42 any interest earned in this or any fiscal year: Provided further, That the account shall be
43 under the control of the District of Columbia Chief Financial Officer, who shall use those
44 funds solely for the purposes of carrying out the Resident Tuition Support Program:
45 Provided further, That the Office of the Chief Financial Officer shall provide a quarterly
46 financial report to the Committees on Appropriations of the House of Representatives and
47 the Senate for these funds showing, by object class, the expenditures made and the
48 purpose therefor.

49

50 **FEDERAL PAYMENT FOR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT**

51 For a Federal payment for a school improvement program in the District of
52 Columbia, \$43,200,000, to remain available until expended, for payments authorized
53 under the Scholarship for Opportunity and Results Act (division C of Public Law 112-10):
54 Provided, That within funds provided for opportunity scholarships \$3,200,000 shall be
55 for the activities specified in sections 3007(b) through 3007(d) and 3009 of such Act.

56

57 **FEDERAL PAYMENT TO THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY**

58 For a Federal payment to the District of Columbia Water and Sewer Authority,
59 \$14,000,000, to remain available until expended, to continue implementation of the Combined
60 Sewer Overflow Long-Term Plan: Provided, That the District of Columbia Water and Sewer
61 Authority provides a 100 percent match for this payment.

62

63 **FEDERAL PAYMENT TO THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE COORDINATING COUNCIL**

64 For a Federal payment to the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council, \$2,000,000, to
65 remain available until expended, to support initiatives related to the coordination of
66 Federal and local criminal justice resources in the District of Columbia.

67

68 **FEDERAL PAYMENT FOR JUDICIAL COMMISSIONS**

69 For a Federal payment, to remain available until September 30, 2018, to the Commission
70 on Judicial Disabilities and Tenure, \$310,000, and for the Judicial Nomination Commission,
71 \$275,000.

72

73 **FEDERAL PAYMENT FOR THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA NATIONAL GUARD**

74 For a Federal payment to the District of Columbia National Guard, \$450,000, to
75 remain available until expended for the Major General David F. Wherley, Jr. District
76 of Columbia National Guard Retention and College Access Program.

77

78 **FEDERAL PAYMENT FOR TESTING AND TREATMENT OF HIV/AIDS**

79 For a Federal payment to the District of Columbia for the testing of individuals
80 for, and the treatment of individuals with, human immunodeficiency virus and acquired
81 immunodeficiency syndrome in the District of Columbia, \$5,000,000.

82

83 **FEDERAL PAYMENT FOR THE FEDERAL CITY SHELTER**

84 For a Federal payment to the District of Columbia for activities to support the
85 redevelopment of the site of the Federal City Shelter, including the development of a

86 replacement shelter and permanent supportive housing, \$9,000,000.

87

88 **FEDERAL PAYMENT FOR EMERGENCY PLANNING AND SECURITY COSTS IN THE DISTRICT OF**
89 **COLUMBIA**

90 For a Federal payment of necessary expenses, as determined by the Mayor of the District
91 of Columbia in written consultation with the elected county or city officials of surrounding
92 jurisdictions, \$34,895,000, to remain available until expended, for the costs of providing public
93 safety at events related to the presence of the National Capital in the District of Columbia,
94 including support requested by the Director of the United States Secret Service in carrying out
95 protective duties under the direction of the Secretary of Homeland Security, and for the costs
96 of providing support to respond to immediate and specific terrorist threats or attacks in the
97 District of Columbia or surrounding jurisdictions: Provided, That, of the amount provided
98 under this heading, \$19,995,000 shall be used for costs associated with the Presidential
99 Inauguration.

100

101 **APPROPRIATION OF CERTAIN INTEREST EARNED**

102 All interest earned on the funds that the District of Columbia received pursuant to the
103 District of Columbia Appropriations Act, 2000, approved November 29, 1999 (113 Stat. 1501;
104 Pub. L. No. 106-113), under the heading “Federal Payment for the Incentives for Adoption of
105 Children” and for the establishment of a scholarship fund for District of Columbia children
106 without parents due to the September 11, 2001 terrorist attack under this same heading, pursuant
107 to the District of Columbia Appropriations Act, 2001, approved December 21, 2001 (115 Stat.
108 923; Pub. L. No. 107-96), shall be retained in the respective funds without reversion to the
109 General Fund and shall be available to the District of Columbia for the purposes of such funds
110 until expended

111

112 Sec. 3. Appropriations request.

113 The Mayor and the Council request that the President transmit this budget request to the
114 Congress and request that the Congress appropriate for the District of Columbia government the
115 funds included in this budget request.

116 Sec. 4. Federal portion of the budget.

117 The federal funds for which Congressional appropriation is requested by this title [act]
118 constitute the federal portion of the annual budget for the District of Columbia government under
119 section 446(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87
120 Stat. 801; D.C. Official Code § 1-204.46(a)).

121 Sec. 5. Fiscal impact statement.

122 The fiscal impact statement of the Chief Financial Officer is adopted as the fiscal
123 impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of
124 1975, approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

125 Sec. 6. Effective date.

126 As provided in section 446(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved
127 December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 801; D.C. Official Code § 1-204.46(a)), this act shall take effect
128 following approval by the Mayor or, in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to
129 override the veto.

130 Sec. 7. Transmittal.

131 As provided in section 446(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved
132 December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 801; D.C. Official Code § 1-204.46(a)), following approval of this
133 act by the Mayor or, in the event of veto of this act by the Mayor, action by the Council to
134 override the veto, the Mayor shall submit this act to the President for transmission to Congress.
