




## REVIEW OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ECOSYSTEM

#### CHANGES TO THE PSJ ECOSYSTEM SINCE 2012



#### CHANGES TO THE YOUTH PSJ ECOSYSTEM SINCE 2012



 Safer Stronger 2.0 passes overwhelmingly, marking sweeping enhancement to accountability

- ACT NOW legislation

-Street Vendor Advancement Act decriminalizes street

-Council withdrew proposed legislation to update DC Criminal Code

Juvenile Carjacking Arrests have seen a sharp rise since 2020, with a more than 2300% increase in 2022 compared to 2012.

Juvenile Homicides increased more than 500% (+16) from 3 in 2012

Juvenile arrests for Unauthorized Use of a Vehicle (UUV) and Stolen Auto saw a dramatic 144% increase in 2020 (from the lowest point in 2013), with a steady decline since.

Overall juv arrests remained within an 11% range from 2012 until 2019. Overall juv arrests drastically decreased in 2020 contrary to juv carjacking, UUV & stolen auto arrests.

The rate of cases filed in CSSD have consistently gone down since 2013 regardless of overall rate of juv arrests.

DYRS Committed Youth Avg Daily Pop fell from 850 in 2012 to 123 in 2023, an 86% decrease

## REBALANCING THE PUBLIC SAFETY ECOSYSTEM

#### **ENACTING THE SECURE DC BILL**

- The Mayor and Council worked together on legislative updates to rebalance our public safety ecosystem and drive down crime
- Councilmember Pinto's Secure DC bill, signed into law by Mayor Bowser in March 2024, included many provisions, incorporating key proposals from the Safer Stronger Amendment Act of 2023 and the Addressing Crime Trends Now Amendment Act of 2023

Topic	Secure DC Provisions				
Drug Free Zones	Allows MPD to interrupt persistent drug activity in open air drug markets. Residents have made clear that their quality of life and ability to enjoy their neighborhoods is being adversely affected by persistent drug activity. Drug cases are more complex to build but, in the meantime, residents deserve to be free from fear and the crime attracted by open air drug markets.				
Organized Retail Theft	Created specific criminal penalties for ORT as a standalone offense.				
Rebuttable Presumption of Pretrial Detention	Made permanent provisions of a rebuttable presumption of pretrial detention for those who commit violent crimes. Since July 2023, the DC jail population has risen to pre-pandemic levels after historical lows during a time of significant increases in violent crime. Data shows more violent offenders are being held pretrial.


