We know how to deliver

Throughout Mayor Bowser's Administration, the Sports Capital has catalyzed economic growth by delivering Audi Field, the CareFirst Arena, the transformation of Capital One, and now, we will deliver a new stadium for the Washington Commanders.

- Major sports are a significant driver of the District's economy, generating **\$5 billion** in 2022 and attracting **7.4 million visitors** in 2023.
- DC's sports teams and their facilities have boosted neighborhood investment, with nearby commercial development outpacing the rest of the city after each facility opened.

We can do it all

- **5,000-6,000 new homes** will be created, including at least **1,500-1,800 affordable homes**.
- The stadium will generate **2,000 permanent full-time and part-time jobs** and **14,000 construction jobs**.
- The Fields at RFK will be preserved and a **\$89 million SportsPlex facility** for DC's youth will be delivered.
- At least **30% of the campus will be parks, trails, and green space**, knitting together thousands of acres of the Anacostia Waterfront.

We will deliver at RFK

- A **\$2.7 billion** investment, the single largest private investment in DC's history, will help activate the campus, deliver jobs, and spark opportunity for DC.
- Campus and stadium activity will generate **\$15.6 billion** in direct spending, delivering lasting economic benefits for all eight wards of DC.
- The roofed stadium will host approximately **200 activations days including 40 major events**.
